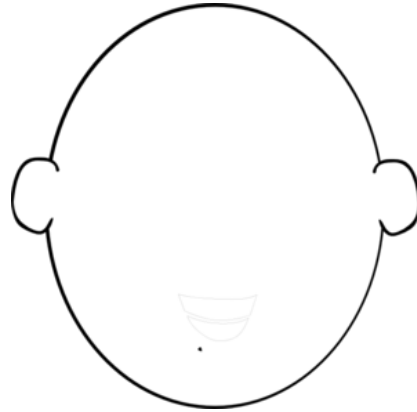

God is like the shepherd. He loves us just as a good shepherd loves his sheep. Count the sheep in the picture. Now colour in the picture.



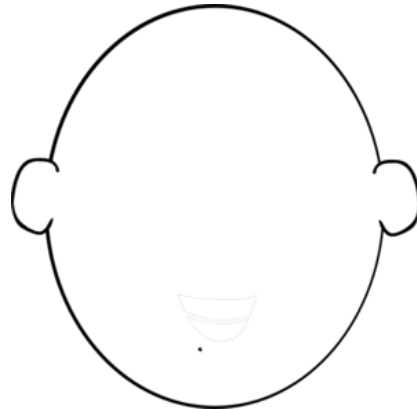
LOST AND FOUND - THE GOOD SHEPHERD

THE GOOD SHEPHERD AND THE LOST SHEEP

There was once a very good shepherd who had 100 sheep. He loved all his sheep and he knew each one of their names. Some people think all sheep look the same, but this shepherd could easily recognise every one of his sheep. One day one sheep went missing. Perhaps the shepherd would think, "It's OK, I don't care, after all, I've got 99 others." Not likely! The shepherd made sure his other sheep were safe and he set off to look for his lost sheep. When he found him, he put him gently on his shoulders and carried him home.

Jesus said that God is like the good shepherd in the story. He is still looking for people who are lost, people who don't know that he loves them and cares for them. God wants us to make right choices but sometimes we don't, we might be unkind or selfish and that makes God sad. 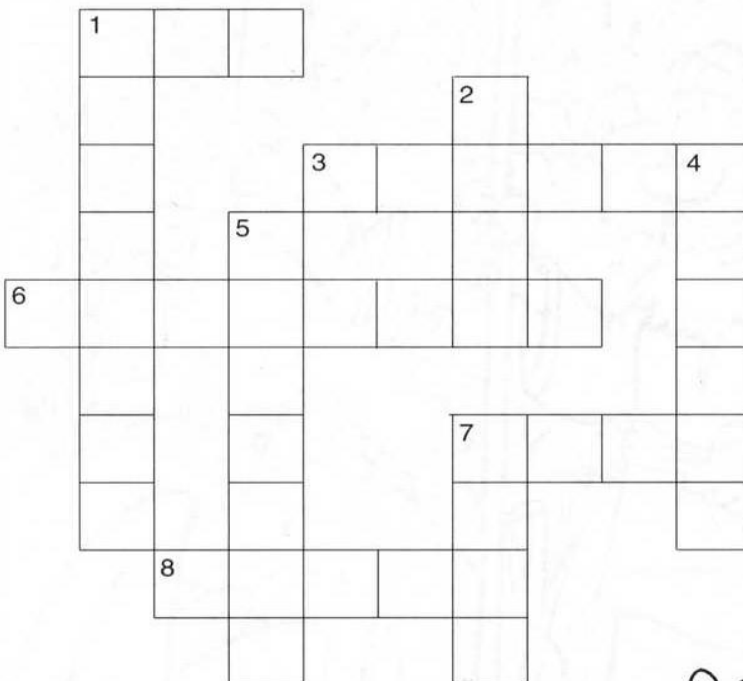

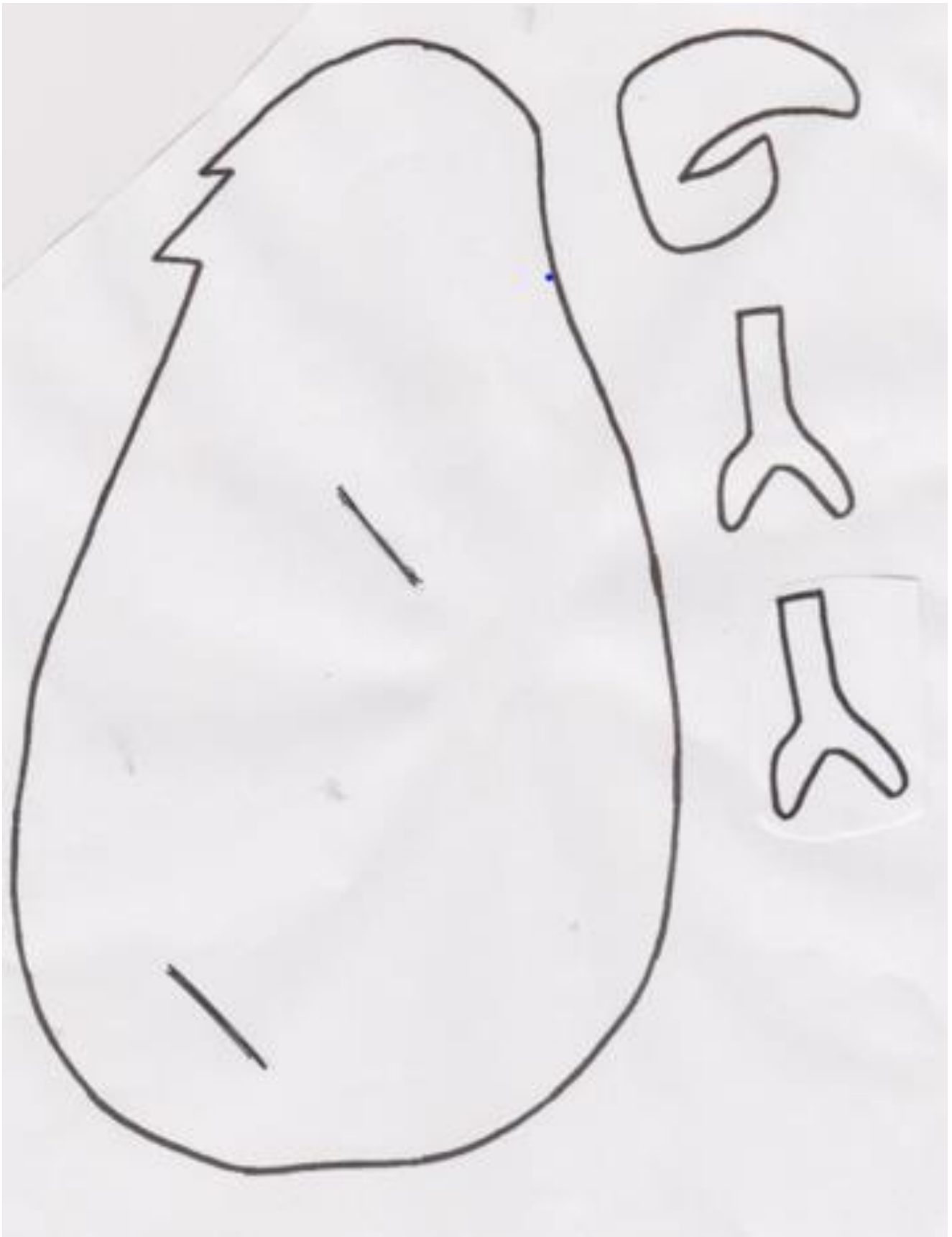

PARROT CRAFT INSTRUCTIONS - iheartcraftythings.com

(CUT OUT 2 BEAKS - ask an adult to cut the slits)





Print the parrot template straight onto card or copy the pattern by hand onto a piece of cardboard.

Cut out the parrot body, feet and two beaks.

Cut 1 cm wide strips from the long side of A4 coloured paper for the tail feathers.

Cut 1 cm wide strips from the short side of A4 coloured paper. (I used 4 different colours.)

Cut the ends of the strips to give them a curved shape.



If you haven't used coloured card you can paint or use crayons to brightly colour both sides of the parrot body.

Use yellow to colour in both sides of the beaks and the feet.

(If you've used paint, make sure it's completely dry.)



Ask an adult to cut 2 slits in the parrot body to push the feathers through, one in the middle for the wing feathers and one at the bottom for the tail feathers.

Hold your strips of tail feathers together tightly and carefully pull them through the slit in the parrot body. Fold the feathers over, spreading them out so they can all be seen. You might need a bit of glue on the feathers to keep them in place.

Do the same thing with the wing feathers.



Glue a yellow beak to both sides of your parrot.

Glue on the feet.

Then add googly eyes if you have them or make your own.

Finish your twirling parrot craft by poking a hole in the top of its head and tying on a piece of string.

DINOSAUR PAPER PLATE CRAFT

This is what you'll need:

Paper plate
Paint and paintbrush or something to colour with
Scissors
Glue
Paper
Lolly Stick (optional)
Green tissue paper (optional)

Instructions:

Print out the dinosaur templates from the link at the top of the page.
(Scroll right down to the bottom of the website for the templates.)
Colour and cut out the pieces.

Cut a paper plate in half and paint the underside whichever colour you would like.

Glue the pieces to the plate like this:

Glue the tail, front leg 2 and back leg 2 to the inside (unpainted side) of the paper plate
(this way they will look hidden by the dinosaur's body).

Glue the front leg 1 and the back leg 1 to the painted side of the paper plate.

Glue the head to the front side of the Brontosaurus body.

Optional:

Glue a lolly stick to the back of your dinosaur if you want to play with it as a puppet and stick small screwed up pieces of green tissue paper to the body.
